Farmworker Unit Initiatives

1. Legal representation of farmworkers and their families, including but not limited to:

- Recovering unpaid wages;
- Redressing violations of health & safety standards on the job and in housing;
- Obtaining medical attention and compensation for workers injured on the job;
- Addressing violations of H-2A workers' contracts;
- Redressing retaliation against workers who seek to assert their rights;
- Obtaining both damages and other civil relief and immigration status for victims of forced labor trafficking.

Farmworker Unit Initiatives

2. Outreach to migrant labor camps.

Staff members conduct regular outreach visits during the growing and harvesting seasons to isolated farmworkers.

They inform workers about their rights and how to exercise them.

Farmworker Unit Initiatives

3. Community education for farmworkers and the general public.

Since the farmworker population is transitory and isolated, the Farmworker Unit makes an active effort to provide information about legal rights through radio, newspaper, skits and visits to community gathering places.

The Farmworker Unit also educates churches, students, and community organizations about farmworker legal issues.
